Dear Library Community,

The Denver Public Library (DPL) had a busy and exciting 2023. Thanks to the generosity of Denver voters, we implemented our first year of funding from *Strong Library, Strong Denver*, supported by the DPL Fund. Thanks to this funding, we were able to deliver on the three key promises we made to the community: expanding access via increased hours, reducing wait times for popular materials, and addressing staff pay plus much more.

Additionally, we made significant progress on several bond-funded renovation projects in the system. In August, we reopened the Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library to the public and celebrated its 20th anniversary. The renovated first-floor features reimagined community and study spaces, public art, and additional displays that celebrate African American legacies and histories.

Construction continued at the Denver Central Library and we opened the new signature event space - The Park View - to the community where public services are temporarily located. We look forward to reintroducing the building to you in 2024! We broke ground on renovations at Athmar Park Branch Library and Pauline Robinson Branch Library. Both locations will receive additions that will expand community gathering spaces and staff spaces.

Amid the hustle and bustle of our multiple large projects, we made the commitment to renew our Strategic Roadmap through 2024 to continue to build on the progress we've made over the past several years. Throughout the year, of course, we still provided our communities with high-quality collections, programming, and services.

As always, we appreciate your support and look forward to bringing you even more in 2024.

Major Library Achievements



Enhanced Teen Spaces Welcome Youth

As one of the last places to truly welcome everybody from all walks of life and all ages, Denver Public Library works to ensure our spaces meet the needs of our communities - this includes teens.

In 2021, the Denver Public Library launched an initiative called Youth Belong at DPL. This brought together community partners along with the youth DPL serves to create a plan to make youth feel more welcome in DPL's locations. Part of this effort led to the creation of dedicated teen spaces at locations designed by teens, for teens.



"There's not a specific space for teens to be except for school and having a space carved out just for teenagers, I think, is really important and gives a sense of belonging," said Esthyr Stucky, Hadley Branch Library Teen Tech who helped design the location's teen space. "I think it's really important to have safe spaces like that."



The spaces incorporate fun colors, comfortable seating, and unique technology. Teens can experience their twist on the library at the Montbello, Hadley, Ford-Warren, Bear Valley, Woodbury, Rodolfo "Corky" Gonzales, and Green Valley Ranch branch libraries, as well as the Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library.

There are still more spaces in the works to make sure teens see themselves at the library including a brand new Teen Space at Denver Central Library funded by *Strong Library, Strong Denver*, supported by the DPL Fund debuting in late 2024.



Major Library Achievements

Reopened Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library After Renovation



In 2023, the Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library celebrated its 20th anniversary and reopened to the public after a year-long renovation. Located in Denver's historic Five Points Neighborhood, the location serves as a full-service branch library, houses collection archives and a research library, and has a museum dedicated to telling the story of African Americans in the Rocky Mountain West. The Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library is one of five African American Research libraries that is part of a public library institution in the United States.

The Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library closed in May 2022 for renovations funded through the 2017 Elevate Denver Bond. The Elevate Denver budget for the project was \$3.7 million. Some highlights of the bond renovation included a redesigned first floor utilizing an open floor plan, a new teen space, a reimagined children's area, new study rooms, a refreshed community room, and incorporation

of African American history throughout the main floor, creating storytelling through imagery from the archives.

The location also received some improvements thanks to funding from *Strong Library, Strong Denver*, supported by the DPL Fund. The improvements on the second and third floors of the building included shelving and cosmetic upgrades.

The renovation was completed in Summer 2023 and Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library reopened with a large community celebration in August. Members of the community packed the parking lot for a ribbon-cutting ceremony and were then welcomed back into their local branch to experience the changes. The fun continued throughout the day with performances, programming, and more.

Make sure to stop by the location to check out the improved spaces.



More Hours, More Access

When measure 2i passed in November 2022, it established what is now known as *Strong Library, Strong Denver*, supported by the DPL Fund. The Fund provides an additional \$32+ million a year for the library. 2023 was the first year of the Fund and as trusted stewards to the community, DPL was able to increase library access in many ways.

The most visible way this occurred was through expanding hours at locations throughout the city. The expansion of hours at five branches across the city starting in July wouldn't have been possible without hiring more staff. These locations added Sunday hours for the first time since the pandemic, extended evening hours, and opened one hour earlier to better serve customers. By the end of 2023, 18 of 27 DPL locations were able to keep their doors open to the community for more hours and more access.

In addition, the DPL Fund also supported a staff bonus in March and, after a completed pay analysis, increased pay for 76% of eligible employees by August 2023. The increased hours and staffing efforts weren't the only highlights of all that *Strong Library, Strong Denver*, supported by the DPL Fund was able to bring to our evolving community.

This funding also allowed DPL cardholders to gain online access to new resources including *The New York Times*, which includes access to NYTimes.com (News & Opinion, Book Review, Wirecutter), Games, NYT Cooking, and The Athletic.

Subscriptions for Ancestry's Fold3 Library Edition, a unique collection of military records, and Newspapers.com World Collection, a vast repository of historical newspapers also became available for curious cardholders looking to do research.

New online resources for cardholders looking to learn, create crafts, or stay entertained include TheShelf TV, Tutor.com, Freegal Music+, Statista, Craftsy and Craftsy en Español.

The library also was able to offer Launchpads as part of the materials to check out. These tablets, geared towards children ages 3-7, come preloaded with exciting games, stories and learning apps all designed to educate in an entertaining way.

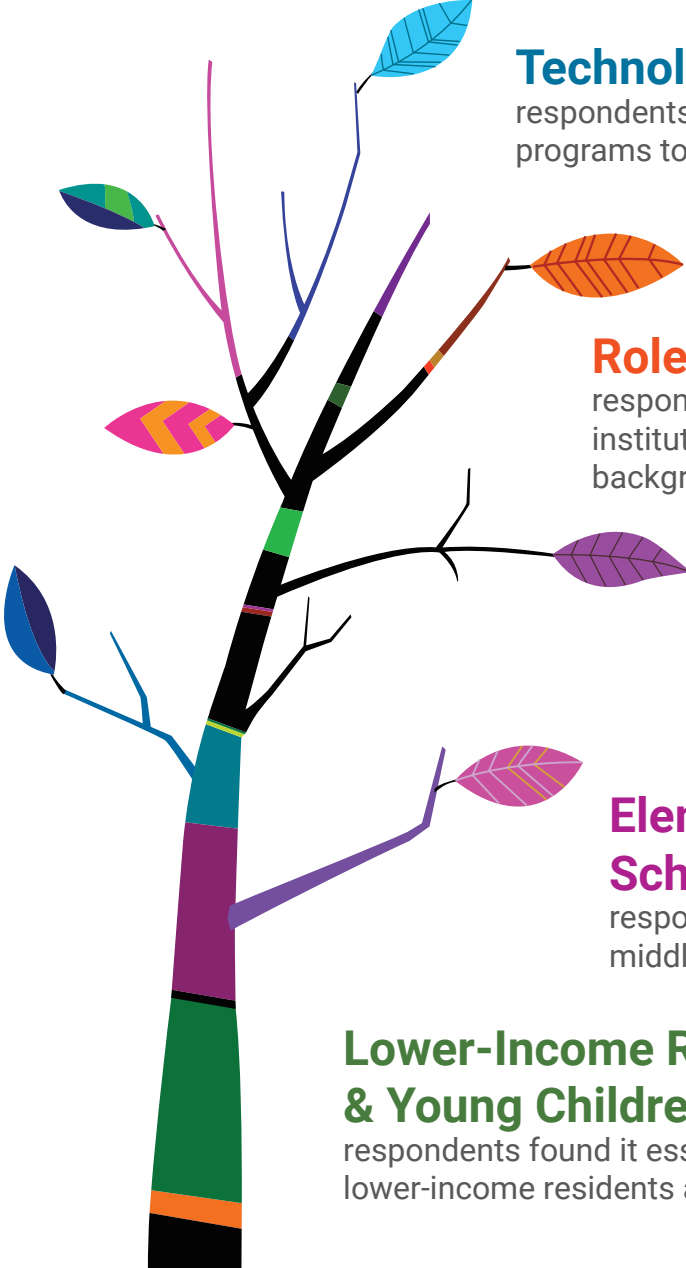

How does the library support the community?

In 2022, the library partnered with the National Research Center at Polco to conduct a survey of 5,500 randomly selected Denver Households balanced across each Council District. The survey had a response rate of 6%, achieving statistical significance; responses were weighted to be representative of the entire city. The library can say, with confidence, that there is a 95% likelihood that the responses reflected in the survey match the sentiment of the Denver population.



Technology Eight out of Ten

respondents considered it essential that the library offers programs to residents without technology at their homes.

Role of Library Eight out of Ten

respondents strongly agreed that the library is a trustworthy institution, that is a welcoming place for people of all backgrounds, and that the library helps them learn and grow.

Use of Funds Nine out of Ten

respondents strongly agreed that the library is a good use of funds.

Elementary and Middle School Kids Seven out of Ten

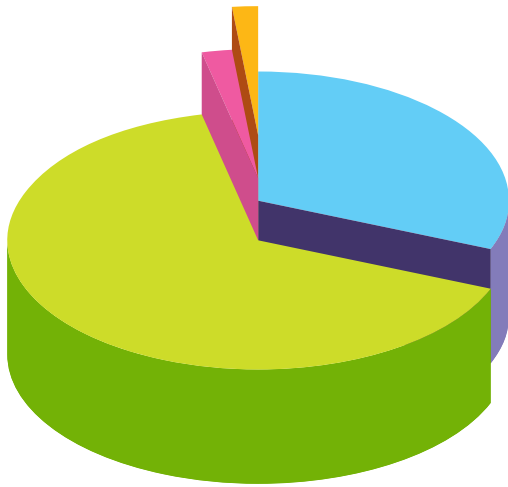
respondents deemed programs for primary/middle school children essential.

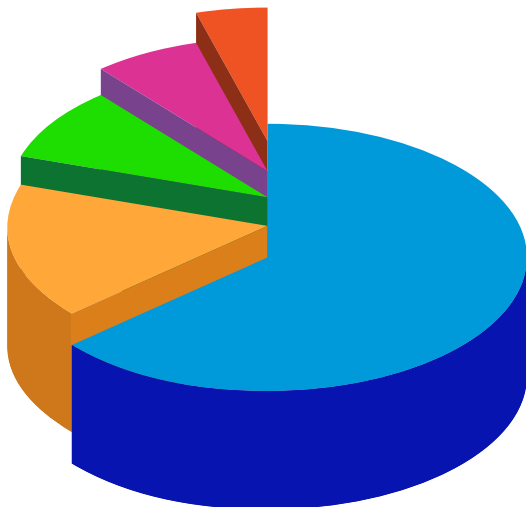

From The Friends Foundation Executive Director And Board Chair

Dear Friends,

2023 was a tremendous year for both Denver Public Library (DPL) and the Friends Foundation. As DPL utilized funds raised by *Strong Library, Strong Denver*, the Friends Foundation held events, stewarded community members, and continued to raise funds and advocate for the library! Here are some highlights from the year:

- The Friends Foundation provided \$1.16 million of support to DPL including funding for children and youth, immigrant and refugee services, collections, and other programming.
- Almost 100 library supporters attended the Holiday Lighting Party for a festive evening with hot chocolate, beautiful lights, creative crafts, carolers, tasty food, and holiday cheer.
- The foundation hosted its first Multi-Day Used Book Sale in three years! The event was held at the Historic Elitch Theater and raised over \$26,000.
- Previous Friends Foundation Board and Library Commission Members attended the Friends Foundation Social hosted by Donald Yale. Attendees reconnected while hearing updates about the Friends Foundation and library, with a special update about the Denver Central library renovation from Anne Pharamond with studiotrope Design Collective.
- In partnership with DPL, the Friends Foundation hosted an Author Talk with Dr. Lisa Damour. She shared valuable insights from her book, *The Emotional Lives of Teenagers: Raising Connected, Capable, and Compassionate Adolescents* with over 120 attendees!
- 500 guests attended the 26th annual Booklovers Ball in October, with a “Fly Me to the Moon” theme at Wings Over the Rockies. The event raised nearly \$400,000!
- On the Advocacy front, the Foundation coordinated library briefings for Mayoral and City Council candidates and for those elected in the 2023 municipal election. The Foundation also supported the library’s budget request, and supported the appropriate use of the *Strong Library, Strong Denver* funding.



- Jeff Riley, Michelle Jeske, and Chris Barge from the Boulder Public Library Friends Foundation presented at the International Public Library Fundraising Conference about the accomplishments of raising \$32 million dollars for Denver Public Library through the *Strong Library, Strong Denver* Ballot Initiative.
- The endowment funds of the Friends Foundation increased by \$1.2 million.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed this year - our donors, sponsors, members, and volunteers. Looking to 2024, we are excited for all the milestones ahead, including the reopening of Denver Central Library and the 27th annual Booklovers Ball. We eagerly anticipate sharing 2024 with you. Booklovers Ball

The Friends Foundation hosted the 26th annual Booklovers Ball in October, with a “Fly Me to the Moon” theme at Wings Over the Rockies. 500 guests gathered for this 1950s-inspired evening to support the library while learning about its history, enjoying delicious food, and dancing to a ten-piece live band. Ruth Yeager, Bob Oswald, Helen O'Callaghan, and Pam Wineman can be seen like clockwork every Thursday in the basement of Denver Central Library, sorting books and uploading books to sell on Amazon. The entire group has volunteered at the Friends Foundation for at least three years. Beyond continuing to donate their time, what makes these volunteers so special?

Andrea Hamilton, the Manager of Philanthropy at the Friends Foundation, who manages the book business, states:

“They are so passionate about Denver Public Library and love the work they do volunteering. Over the last three years, we have undergone a lot of construction at Denver Central Library - there has been dust and noise, but they show up regardless! They truly enjoy the work they do and feel like family! I am grateful to them for all they do.”

So, what motivates this group of volunteers to come in every week? Pam Wineman shares her thoughts:

“My mother was a career public school librarian, and I've been a voracious reader my whole life ... we're so fortunate here in Denver to have this amazing library system staffed with people who are committed to making sure everyone has access to books and all kinds of resources and information ... it's really special to be a small part of that.”

For others, volunteering after retirement is an opportunity to meet new people and socialize. Helen shared that sorting through the donated books allowed them to see a person's entire life story.

Whatever the reason, these volunteers have shown tremendous commitment to supporting the Friends Foundation and advocating for the library. Thank you to all of the tremendous volunteers who support the Used Book Program; your support is truly a gift!



Friends Feature: Taylor Kirkpatrick



Taylor Kirkpatrick's passion for philanthropy was instilled in him by his mother. "She taught us very early in our lives about the importance of giving back, demonstrating gratitude, and getting involved in the communities in which we live and work." Additionally, he values the democratization of information libraries provide. "A library can even the playing field and serve as a place where everybody can collect information and also be a safe space for people to share their opinions. There are very few institutions in the world

where somebody says: 'Do you have this?' And the answer is unflinchingly, 'Yes.' The library has information about every single topic on earth. And so if the goal is to become better, kinder, smarter, [and/or] more informed, a library is a critical cultural asset."

Taylor has been interested in books and going to libraries since he was young. He shared, "I grew up going to the Ross-University Hills Branch Library, and I remember very distinctly



a big display of Eric Carle's 'Very Hungry Caterpillar' when I first got there. Somebody had made a cardboard cutout of the caterpillar, and I remember him vividly. And that was 45 years ago." His favorite book growing up was "Mike Mulligan and the Steam Shovel" written by Virginia Lee Burton in 1939. Taylor was so impacted by the story that at age six, he asked his mother for bookcase headboards to store and organize (and reorganize) all of the books he had collected.

In his adult life, Taylor's love of libraries has blossomed. He has donated to the Friends Foundation since 2006 - almost 20 years! Additionally, he made a significant contribution in support of the most recent Denver Central Library renovation. Beyond his financial support, Taylor has been involved with the Friends Foundation and Denver Public Library (DPL) in a multitude of ways. He was on the Friends Foundation Board and then was appointed to the library Commission by Mayor Hickenlooper and later reappointed by Mayor Hancock. He served as the President of the Library Commission and was involved in hiring Denver Public Library's City Librarian and Executive Director, Michelle Jeske. He served on the Western History and Genealogy Acquisitions Committee and volunteered for Denver Public Library's Read Aloud program.

Taylor's influence in the literary world extends beyond his local community. He is a member of the Smithsonian's Libraries and Archives Advisory Board, a testament to his expertise and passion.

Additionally, he is the Chair of the Grabhorn Institute / Arion Press in San Francisco, one of the most esteemed letter presses in the US, where he champions the art of bookmaking. He is also an active member of the Grolier Club in New York and the Caxton Club in Chicago, two long-standing organizations dedicated to the printed page. His love for books is further demonstrated by the establishment of the Kirkpatrick Prize, a prestigious award for Colorado book collectors under 30. Finally, he has written books as well, including the award-winning children's book, *Worthwhile*.

Taking into account how the needs of the community have shifted from when Central was last renovated in 1995, the current Central renovation will ensure there are more adequate spaces to support the needs of the community. From more computers, spaces for technology use, event spaces, a teen library, and much more, Taylor's support of the renovation will be recognized in the Children's Library Programming Space. This area will be used for storytime, community event performances, free play, author visits, parenting classes, school field trips, book clubs, and much more!

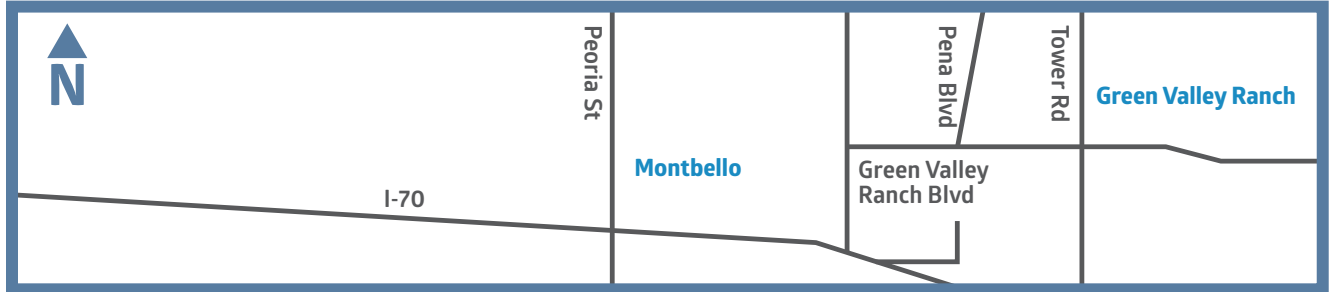
